

**U.S. Foodservice, Inc.’s Application for Allowance and Immediate Payment of  
(I) Administrative Expense Claim for Goods Received by the Debtor Postpetition, and  
(II) Administrative Expense Claim for Goods Received by the Debtor Within Twenty Days  
of the Petition Date (the “USF Motion”)**

By the USF Motion, U.S. Foodservice, Inc. (“USF”) seeks entry of an order allowing USF’s prepetition and postpetition administrative expense claims and directing the Debtors pay such allowed claims immediately.

USF alleges that the Debtors owe (i) \$24,735.18 for food and food-related products (the “Prepetition Goods”) that USF supplied to Resort at Singer Island Properties, Inc. (“Singer Island”) within 20 days before August 4, 2008 (the “Petition Date”), and (ii) \$12,663.47 for food and food-related products that USF supplied the Singer Island after the Petition Date (the “Postpetition Goods” and, together with the Prepetition Goods, the “Goods”). USF further alleges that (a) is has not been paid for the Goods, and (b) USF timely filed a proof of claim for amounts owed with respect to the Prepetition Goods.

USF maintains that it is entitled to administrative expense priority for their claims relating to the amount the Debtors owe with respect to the Goods. Furthermore, USF asserts that the Court should compel the Debtors to pay USF for their claims immediately.
